A visit to the botanical garden



In Coral Gables, one of the most classic and characteristic suburbs of Miami, is the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden, a garden of more than 83 hectares of vegetation. In 1938 it was founded by Dr. David Fairchild, one of the most iconic botanists in American history.

The garden has more than 3,400 species of butterflies, exotic plants and tropical fruits. The place offers a magical atmosphere to visit with the family, have a picnic afternoon or explore it calmly. Guided tours and exhibitions, such as the Tropical Flower Garden and the Water Gardens, are also part of the experience.

Fairchild also organizes art exhibitions, concerts and cultural events so that its visitors can enjoy the experience of breathing fresh air and being surrounded by nature. This magical garden has even been the scene of love stories, since it is also possible to hold outdoor weddings. To enter, there is a fee from \$11 for children seven years and older, up to \$24 for adults.
