## **Plein Air Painting Kit**

I'm tailoring this to oils, but acrylic is welcome too. Most of the color names are the same, but if you're bringing acrylic don't forget to bring whatever medium, if any, you like to add, and also a good spray bottle to keep your palette misted.

- Easel or blanket: We will have tables set up for those who want to use a table top easel. Or bring a field easel with legs to set up wherever you find the best view! If you like to paint on the ground, which is really nice and simple to set up sometimes, bring a blanket.
- 2. <u>Gamsol</u> if you like to use a solvent
- 3. Linseed oil or similar
- 4. Brushes: Bring your favorites! If you'd like recommendations, my personal favorites are the Dakota and Aspen Series by Princeton and I typically stick with the "Bright" shape, with a smaller round as well. Find a <u>Set of 4 assorted shapes</u> here, or here is a <u>link to my</u> <u>favorite size and shape</u>.
- 5. Paper towels or painting rag
- 6. Miscellaneous: Water, Other Drinks, Snacks, Sun Hat
- 7. Paints of course :)

Basic colors for a landscape kit: (You will likely have many others that you like to bring, but this is a really good starting point if you are new)

A good neutral yellow like Hansa Yellow, Cadmium Yellow light, or Lemon Yellow Alizarin Crimson Quinacridone Magenta Ultramarine Blue King's Blue or similar light blue Sap Green Yellow Ochre Burnt Sienna Raw Umber Violet Titanium White

Bonuses that I always bring: Indian Yellow Phthalo Blue Green Gold Persian Rose Payne's Gray
