Watercolor & Drawing Class with Artist Dan Bondroff Supply List

Pencils

1-2 number 2 pencils. Also known as 2H pencils Any brand pencil will do.

Sharpie Markers

1 Black Ultrafine 1 Black Fine

Eraser

1 white plastic eraser Any brand, avoid gummy erasers

Pencil sharpener

Any small handheld pencil sharpener. The small inexpensive metal ones work well.

Watercolor Set

Koi Watercolor set – 24 colors. This is a nice set for the money and for the purposes of quick sketches

3-4 Watercolor brushes

Watercolor or multi-purpose brushes filbert sizes 2,4,6.

Keep in mind sizes can vary by brand. To keep it simple, have a small, medium, and wide brush that you think you would be comfortable painting with. I often use a brush that's about 1/4" wide to color an entire small sketch. You probably won't need anything wider than 3/8".

A pad or sketchbook of thick white paper (preferably watercolor paper)

Paper needs to be thick enough to take light watercolor washes without falling apart. Strathmore 400 series watercolor sketchbook is good quality. No larger than 11x14.

Printed photos

Print out of source photos that will be supplied as digital files before class begins.

It's possible to work from digital files on a phone or tablet, but not recommended.

Drawing board

Not necessary if you work in a sketchbook. Feel free to use one if you wish to remove pages from the drawing pad and have them loose on the table. If you do, I recommend a roll of white artist tape to adhere your drawing to the board.
