## Beginners Watercolor Class Supply List Jan. 27- March 10 2025

Here is your supply list. I included just the necessities so you don't spend a lot of money or feel overwhelmed. As you continue painting, you will probably want to add more to your tool box but this list will get you started in the right direction.

You can go to our local Blicks and will receive a 10% student discount when you show them your class registration email. :) Jerry's Art Supply is another great option. It's fun to shop in person and stay local.

- 1. One medium sized round brush like this one from <a href="Princeton">Princeton</a>\*. I also like the inexpensive <a href="KingArt brushes">KingArt brushes</a> -they have a very sharp tip.
- 2. A roll of paper towels
- 3. A large container for water like an empty yogurt container
- 4. Arches 140lb Cold Pressed Sketchbook.\*\* Also sold at Blicks.
- 5. Masking tape or artist tape. I like the white artist tape from Blicks.
- 6. A pair of scissors.
- 7. A water spritzer. This one from Holbein is my favorite. Also sold at Blicks.
- 8. A watercolor palette. There are so many out there! I like this one. You can also see lots of options at Blicks. Plastic or ceramic is fine.
- 9. Pencil and eraser.

## PAINTS:

Just like it's best to use professional watercolor paper, it's important to also use professional paints from a tube.

10. This <u>set by Daniel Smith</u> is a perfect starter pack. It has one warm and cool version of each primary color. If you don't have any professional tube watercolor paints, this is what I recommend buying.
