WORKSHOP MATERIALS

Set of Gouche Pigment – Format: Tubes or Pans. Basic set of 6 to 12 or greater.

I found the following brands pleasant to work with – Winsor & Newton Designer, Shinhan Designer, Holbein, Utrecht and/or Lucas. Aim for quality over quantity – you can accomplish much with a limited palette of high-grade pigment. Student grade is good but may not offer the desired coverage power and vibrancy that professional grades can.

Paper Selection – Smooth Hot Press watercolor paper will work best – any size. Arches is a great brand to consider.

Mediums: These are optional, but greatly recommended –

Masking Fluid Medium – protects the paper surface from any paint – any brand.

Blending Medium – slows down the drying time of paint and facilitates blending – any brand.

Small assorted selection of Round and Flat format brushes – size ranging anywhere from 0 to 12. Consider size of brush in relation to scale of artwork.

Containers for water

Watercolor type palette

Tombow Mono Zero Round Eraser – pen style eraser great for detail editing

HB or lighter lead graphite pencil, knead eraser, sharpener, ruler, and artist masking tape

Supplies Container – A general box will do.
